



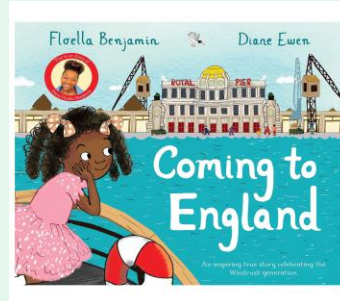

Write stories linked to the past, include adjectives, prepositions, similes, fronted adverbials and speech.

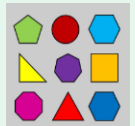
You can help your child at home by:

- Read and enjoy different texts at home, fiction and non-fiction.

Maths



Learning Focus: Number



Key language:

Place value, hundreds, tens, ones, column addition, subtraction, multiplication, division

You can help your child at home by:

- Count in 2s, 5s, 10s, 3s, 4s
- Use times tables in everyday situations 'How many groups of...?'
- Using money in real-life situations.

Computing

Focus: Programming: Computer Systems and networks / Online Safety

Key Skills & Vocab:

- Logging on
- Keyboard and mouse skills
- Internet
- Network
- Routers
- WiFi / wireless



Key language:

Networks / connection / wireless / files / information / transfer / websites / sharing information.

History:



Focus: Stone-Age to Iron-Age

Key skills:

- Introduce a timeline that is divided into BCE, CE, BC and AD and place today, current study and key events
- Explore evidence of why people in the past may have acted in the way they did. e.g. use evidence such as a diary to explain reasons
- Derive questions based on more than 1 source e.g. why, what, when, who, where, how.
- Use primary sources and secondary sources to support interpretations of the past.

Science

Focus: Scientific Enquiry



Key skills:

- Learn how to set up and complete a scientific experiment
- Think like a scientist
- Learn how to record results like a scientist

During this unit children will learn how to think about and set up scientific experiments including a solar oven and observe a range of products to clean coins. They will learn how to ask scientific questions and record data.

Religious Education (RE)



Focus: How do Hindu's worship?

This term we will explore Hinduism and how Hindu's worship at home and in the Mandir. This will include a visit from a Hindu Priest.
